WARM BLANKETS ORPHAN CARE AT A GLANCE



Warm Blankets Orphan Care is a non-governmental Christian organization, dedicated to Biblical solutions to injustice in areas of extreme instability. WBOCI rescues and cares for orphans in nine countries in Asia and Africa. We are raising thousands of orphans in hundreds of Church Orphan Homes to be disciples of Christ and leaders in their generation.

Our church orphan homes are not institutions or orphanages; they are homes. These homes are intended to foster family relationships and to nurture the children in their physical, emotional,

and spiritual needs. The first floor of each home is also a church which serves the needs of—and witnesses daily to—the surrounding community.

With a holistic approach to devastated children's needs, we restore shattered childhoods in Christ. We strive to help orphans rise above traumatic conditions and provide them with the hope, knowledge, and strength to transform their destitute nations, one life at a time, from the inside out.



INDIVIDUAL COUNTRY HIGHLIGHTS

BURKINA FASO

Last year we told you about a great new opportunity we had in Burkina Faso and a new frontier to serve orphans and widows in West Africa. In 2010, through partnership with ICM, construction was completed on one home: the Bendogo Church Orphan Home, which is now a loving family environment and safe haven for 21 children. Burkina Faso is ranked one of the poorest countries in the world. Only 15% of its population is literate. Combined with a stronghold of primitive and sometimes cruel religious traditions of animism, it is a hostile environment for orphaned and abandoned children.

The Stafford Center, consisting of two homes for a total of 80 orphaned children, an educational center, and a clean water station, will be opened and dedicated in March of 2011. It will serve as a showcase for western, French-speaking Africa and will reach out to the 16 surrounding countries. This is only the beginning of the story of transformed lives in West Africa!



CAMBODIA

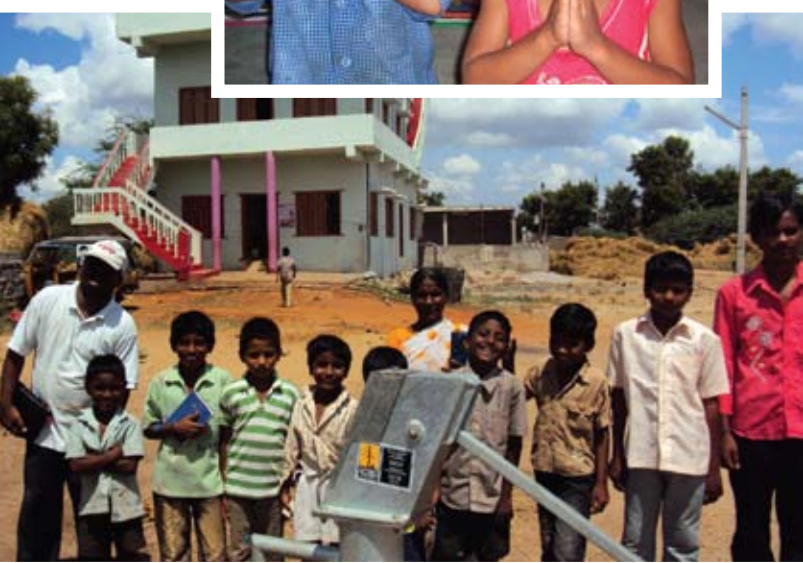
WBOCI has 109 Church Orphan Homes in Cambodia and has been working in-country for over 10 years. You are helping us care for thousands of kids in Cambodia alone, and we have seen so many of them grow up right before our eyes. Here is a fly-by of what's new in Cambodia.

- » Orphans are on fire for Christ and are engaging in more and more evangelism! What started out as a group of young pastors and older orphans traveling and sharing the Gospel has now spread like wildfire and all of the kids want to be involved! Young Tigers, Young Lions, Fisherman, and Daughters of Deborah work tirelessly and pray without ceasing, for the transformation of their country and their generations for Christ!
- » The ESL/Vocational Training program is exploding! All the kids are anxiously awaiting their turn to spend some time at our training center in Phnom Penh to learn English. They love using the Rosetta Stone software and are really making progress! For them, it is more than just a curiosity or an eagerness to learn; English proficiency is the number one way they can get a job. Many of our kids want to be pastors, doctors, lawyers, dentists, pharmacists, and anything else they can dream of. . . And they don't just dream, they are really succeeding thanks to your support!
- » Another aspect of this program is vocational training and microenterprise. Some of our young women make beautiful homemade bags and purses that you'd have to see to believe! One young man is organizing a business focusing on cultural dancers at tourist attractions. Others sell crickets (we hear they are delicious fried), and raise quail to sell the eggs.
- » Contributors and their friends are using their skills to take care of the kids in person. Dental and medical teams worked on thousands and thousands of little teeth, and also provided x-ray machines, lab equipment for blood work, and a refracting machine to test eyes and give prescriptions.
- » The Women's Dormitory and Restoration Center currently houses over 150 women, and funding has been received to give the dormitory the finishing touches it needs to feel like a home and to serve as an evangelistic launch pad. The women in the dorm are thriving and fulfilling its purpose as an outreach center for their colleagues in Phnom Penh's garment factories. We are thrilled to report that some of these women have recently made decisions for Christ and made it public through baptism!
- » In-country partners have been investing their blood, sweat, and tears to improve the rice production to help supplement the kids' nutrition. They go through a couple TONS of rice per DAY, so this will certainly save money. They are using western techniques and technology that will bring Cambodian soil up to US quality in the next three to five years, investing in the whole nation!



DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF THE CONGO

Our goal in the DRC in 2010 seemed simple: keep the children in our care safe and stable. It ended up requiring a lot of prayer and support! Just east of Kinshasa, the capitol city and location of our two Church Orphan Homes, violence and mass rapes were sending aftershocks throughout the whole nation. Women and children fled the area over the course of the year and sought refuge in Kinshasa. Thankfully, our goal was achieved and all of our kids are doing well. We hope to find more consistent supporters for the Kinshasa East and West boys and girls homes in 2011 as we see the great need in the Democratic Republic of the Congo and the violence continue. In order to care for more orphans and widows, WBOCI hopes to open a third Church Orphan Home north of Kinshasa, though plans are still tentative.



INDIA

Wells, wells, wells! A dozen wells were installed in 2010, in partnership with Living Water International and generous donors. The kids in our Church Orphan Homes in India couldn't be happier. We will be installing 12 more in 2011!

Nearly 20 other Church Orphan Homes are built and waiting for kids to smudge their walls and trample through their hallways. We need consistent home sponsorship in order to fill these homes and hope to build strong relationships with people who love orphans in India in 2011.

INDONESIA

October of 2010 brought an earthquake, a tsunami, and a tragic volcanic eruption to Indonesia. WBOCI partners were on the ground, rescuing children and providing for the basic needs of over a thousand grieving families. They also opened a new radio station, preaching the Gospel to those who had lost everything.

You would never know it by seeing how much passion our kids in Indonesia have about sharing the Gospel, but Indonesian Christians have a very high potential for persecution as Indonesia is the world's largest Islamic country. One of our main focuses there is on protecting the kids, so the kids' main focus can be on growing, learning, having fun, and sharing their love for Jesus!

A few of the teenagers have a passion for worship and evangelism and came up with the idea to lead worship and share the Gospel with kids who have experienced the same trauma and loss as they have. This year, they got a portable "gig kit" to allow them to travel and do worship outreach at refugee camps. Hundreds came to Christ in 2010, and we believe God has some big plans for them this year!

We opened a new home in Denpasar in 2010 that is now caring for 11 orphaned children, offering them a second chance at childhood. On the docket for 2011 is the opening of a new home in Rote, a remote and gorgeous island, with the possibility of another new home in the works! An outbreak of tuberculosis on the island a few months ago already called for rescues of many children, and the momentum has continued into 2011.

Our kids in Indonesia are dreaming for a training center similar to WBOCI Cambodia. As we care for more children in Indonesia, this seems crucial to their growth. We are praying with them for that this year!





KENYA/SUDAN

The highlight of our work in Kenya in 2010 was the emotional and exciting dedication of the Ephraim Church Orphan Home in January, but did not shadow the growth of two other Church Orphan Homes.

- » The Ephraim home is home to nearly 40 orphaned and abandoned children, and is still a work in progress. Over the course of 2010 we finished up some tiling and added a deep water well and in 2011 we will finish work on a kitchen prep area.
- » Construction has been moving along well for the Bosnia home in Bosnia, Kenya as well. It will bless a community of Internally Displaced Persons who have been living packed together on a small plot of land for eight years after severe unrest in the Mt. Elgon area.
- » In October of 2010, we also started construction on a home in Lodwar, Kenya. 35 orphaned children will call it their own in a few months! It will be a key location for refugees coming south out of Sudan if and when political unrest and violence increase there in the coming months.

PAKISTAN

Violent floods poured through Pakistan in 2010, killing hundreds and stranding millions. Thankfully, Warm Blankets Orphan Care's homes were safe and sound during the destruction. In partnership with the Pakistani church, WBOCI provided relief such as food, Bibles, and blankets to displaced families, sharing the Gospel every step of the way. Pakistan's volatile government means we don't get to visit as much as we'd like but we rely on our in-country partner's wisdom and leadership there. Imagine what young Pakistani orphans on fire for Christ can do to transform their nation in a few years. We can't wait to find out!



THAILAND

WBOCI continues to support orphans and widows in Chiang Mai, Thailand. In 2010, we received a matching grant to buy land and build them a bigger home, as the kids are currently living in a rental home.

Our kids in Thailand are working hard to build skills that will last them a lifetime! The entrepreneurship of the widows and creativity of the kids has led to something beautiful from some slimy little worms. Silkworms are now providing an interesting and creative new way to build their skills.

With the guidance of widows of the community, the kids learn valuable lessons in responsibility as they feed and care for hundreds of silkworms. Then the real fun begins! They harvest the beautiful threads the silkworms produce and use them for intricate weaving projects. This is an important



aspect of their culture that they are able to preserve and maintain.

In addition to caring for some of the cutest kids in the country, our WBOCI partner is constantly heading out to the refugee camps to minister to and share the Gospel with Hill Tribe and Burmese refugees in Thailand's northern hills. Join us in praying for that ministry in 2011.



- » We are building a new Church Orphan Home in Kampala, called "Wakiso". It will be dedicated in early 2011.
- » A current Church Orphan Home in Jinja will be rebuilt to replace its makeshift wooden structure with a solid bricks and mortar home.
- » Plans are in the works to build another home west of Kampala in the village of Mesaka, to be called "Buwemba".
- » Lake Albert also looks like a great spot for a new Church Orphan Home, so we are looking into building there too.

UGANDA

WBOCI's work in Uganda is spreading like wildfire! With four different in-country partners in Uganda alone, the opportunities for strategically placed Church Orphan Homes are numerous. Here are just a few.

The three homes currently caring for orphans and widows are also reaching out to their communities!

In 2010, through Small Group Programs (<http://smallgroupprograms.org>) a small group provided the funding to plant a rice field in Gulu, an area with multiple refugee camps and in serious need of food. They harvested their first crop in October of 2010 and are keeping seeds to plant in 2011 and increase their capability.

Also on the horizon for 2011? Clean water! WBOCI is looking to put wells into each home, providing clean and fresh water for whole communities. Can you tell we are so excited about the progress in this country? This geographic spread is having a huge impact!

OTHER MINISTRY HIGHLIGHTS

HAITI EARTHQUAKE RELIEF

WBOCI's involvement in Haiti continues to grow as the need increases after 2010's catastrophic earthquake. We partnered with churches in Haiti to provide relief and were able to ship a container packed with food, shoes, anti-bacterial hand sanitizer to help minimize the spread of cholera, and half a million vegetable seeds. The seeds will be distributed through the churches as 'seeds of promise' and will be a source of sustainable nutrition and a powerful evangelism opportunity. EAST AFRICA FOOD DISTRIBUTION

With the help of treasured partners and generous donors, Warm Blankets Orphan Care sent 2 containers of delicious chickpeas and dehydrated vegetable soup to starving men, women, and children in Kenya and Uganda. This food, distributed through the Church and in Jesus' name, meant the difference between life and death for so many, and for everyone it has been a blessing and tangible proof that there is a God who loves them and cares about their needs.

WBOCI partner in Kenya distributed millions of nutritious meals to dozens of local orphanages and schools which help to care for orphans and at-risk children, as well as to widows living with HIV/AIDS and groups of elderly people living together in the villages. In addition, we gave food to about 5 dozen widows living in extreme poverty in an area where Warm Blankets Orphan Care hopes to have a presence with a Church Orphan Home in the future. The food reached as far in Kenya as the cities of Lodwar and Pokot, two desperate and hungry regions. A portion was also sent to Uganda, where WBOCI's partner there distributed it through his churches, located in areas of extreme poverty and great need.

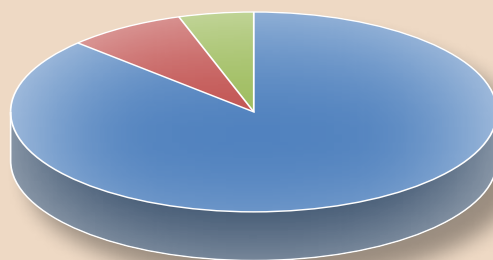
